COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The main text for this class will be Plato's Menexelmushe opening scenef this dialogueSocrates engages young

EVALUATION:

1. Preparation and Participation: 20

In this course youwill consolidate your knowledge of the elements of Greek grammar and syntax and develop an ability to read Greek prose texts. For this purposesvill spend most of our time translating and analyzing in great detable funeral oration in Plato's Menexensus passages from various ther Athenian logoi epitaphioiif time permits. As homework students are expected by prepare one to two pages of our primary text. Preparation entables oking up unfamiliar words and forms, being able to explain the workings of the syntax (e.g. why does this noun appear in the genitive or what is the function of that participle?) and producing a precise translation at the beginning of each classe will do a quick review of the passage overed in the previous class, by having one student read the Greek and provide a fluid translation. Students are expected translatiopate fully in the class, both in terms of completing assignments and in terms of listening attentively and participating in class discussions (20% of final mark).

- 4. Those who miss classes or parts of classes remain responsible for material they have missed. Students a encouraged to form study groups in order to assist each other in preparing for tests and for discussion of assigne readings.
- 5. There is no extra credit in this course; there will be nweighting of the course components.
