Have opposing ideas been acknowledged and given a convincing response?

## ORGANIZATION

Do paragraph breaks reflect a meaningful shift in topic? Does the opening sentence of each paragraph identify the central idea of that paragraph and its relationship to the thesis?

## **USE OF SOURCES**

Is there textual evidence to back up each claim in the paper? Is there an attention to detail (word choice, imagery, etc.) that adds intricacy to the argument?

Are quotations integrated smoothly and cited correctly?

## STYLE

Is the writing style clear, concise, and readable, so that the focus falls on the ideas in the paper?
