The Department of Psychiatry, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, is inviting applications for **1** clinical academic faculty position within the division of General Adult Psychiatry within one of our affiliated teaching hospitals, St. Joseph's Health Care London. The Department seeks colleagues who are interested in being part of a dynamic team and committed to providing evidence-informed, compassionate clinical care.

We are inviting applications for a 0.8 FTE to 1.0 FTE psychiatrist to provide services with the Elgin Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) 2 team of the Assessment, Treatment & Rehabilitation Program, part of St. Joseph's Health Care London's Mental Health Care program.

The Elgin ACT 2 Team provides intensive rehabilitation and treatment supports for individuals living with serious mental illnesses in St. Thomas and the Elgin County area using an interdisciplinary approach. Like all St. Joseph's mental health teams, the team aims to provide recovery-oriented care through a psychosocial rehabilitation lens. The team is part of the two ACT teams and Adult Ambulatory team in Elgin County and collaborates with the services of partners at St. Thomas-Elgin General Hospital and the local CMHA.

The team is located in St. Thomas, a town of just under 40,000 people, approximately 30 minutes from London, 15 minutes from Highway 401, and 20 minutes to Port Stanley on Lake Erie.

The ideal candidates in all of the above roles will have experience and/or training in psychosocial rehabilitation and recovery-oriented care. Candidates with experience in education, research, leadership, QI, or program development will be preferred. The successful candidate will have opportunities to contribute further in these areas, and will have additional opportunity within the Department.

The successful candidate will serve as a role model and supervisor for our undergraduate medical students, psychiatry residents, and clinical research fellows. The candidate must have a strong academic background and a keen interest in academic medicine, demonstrated scholarly productivity and the ability to collaborate effectively with all members of the health care team and office administration staff.

Applications will be accepted until the position is filled. Review of applications will begin after August 2, 2024, with an anticipated start date of October 1, 2024 or as negotiated.

Remuneration will be based on qualifications and experience and will be composed primarily on the following sources; salary, fee for service, alternative funding plan, and academic support.
