The Alice Munro Chair in Creativity will recognize and honour our Nobel laureate, inspire students, build diverse cultural communities within the university and beyond, and foster creative expression of all kinds. The Faculty of Arts and Humanities welcomes nominations of and applications from creative practitioners of national and international stature including but not limited to creative writers, filmmakers, visual artists or performing artists.

Alice Munro is counted among Western University's most extraordinary alumni. Her first connection to the Department of English came in 1949, when she entered Western as an undergraduate pursuing an English major and shortly thereafter achieved her first publication in a campus literary magazine, *Folio*. - x Allow the University to enhance and expand the Writer-in-Residence program;
- x Provide the University with access to a world of writing and artistic creation beyond Canada, allowing the University to attract international authors and artists as speakers and collaborators;
- x Present the annual Alice Munro Lecture on Creativity.
