4. Ethics Test (22.5%)

Every healthcare professional at some point comes face-to-face with an ethical dilemma or legal issue. The dilemmas and issues are many and varied and could involve anything from a conflict with a colleague or superior, to a privacy breach (e.g., client personal health information gone missing), to a complaint by a client to your regulatory body about the quality of your service. In this test, 2 to 3 ethical cases will be presented and using the information presented in class you will be asked to answer a total of 25 to 30 MC questions related to the cases.

5. Final Examination (40%)

The final exam will be cumulative (meaning all material covered since the first class will be fair game). However, about 20% of the exam material will be drawn from the first 2/3 of the course (before Ethics Test), and about 80% from the second half.
