Once the petition and supporting documents have been received and assessed, appropriate academic considerations shall be determined by academic counseling, in consultation with the VWXGHQW¶V LQVWUXFWRU V \$FDGHPLF FRQVLGHUDWLRQV PDL\ LQF attendance requirements for classes/labs/tutorials, arranging Special Exams or Incompletes, re-weighting course requirements, or granting late withdrawals without academic penalty.
