onths Often SLPs found that the onth intervals did not align well with their intervention or they si ply did not have the resources ti e to be co pleting it this often The second ost cited barrier was beliefs about consequences This barrier depicts SLPs belief that the outco e easure lacks benefit in clinical practice or the SLPs did not believe the data being collected was useful for clinical practice or for the govern ent The third ost cited barrier was social influences Social influences indicate that the SLPs otivation to co plete the FOCUS was lessened by negative reactions fro fa ilies At ti es fa ilies found the FOCUS difficult to co plete as their child would score quite low on each state ent Filling out the for s was a re inder to the parents that their child was not on level with others their age

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
