Film 3340G (001) Japanese National Cinema Winter 2024

Prerequisites: At least 60% in Film Studies 1020E or Film Studies 1022 or permission of the Department.

Course Description

This course focuses on both Japan and the cinema: each week we will study a specific historical context and a particular argument in film studies brought into focus by that week's films. For example, we will consider the relation between traditional aesthetics and Japanese cinema; Japan's burgeoning

addition to critically appraising various films and theoretical approaches, we will study the connections between cinema and parallel institutions such as radio, television, and the record industry, as well as intermedia relations between cinema and theatre, literature, manga, and anime.

All readings on the course are in English; no Japanese is required.
