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French 3900
Two 0.5 credits from French 2905A/B, French 2906A/B, French 2907A/B (or French 2900)

This course will enable students to improve their written communication skills in French. The emphasis will be placed on the practical development of writing abilities through in-class exercises, and a review of the principles of composition, of various rhetorical styles (description, narration, argumentation, etc.) and of writing mechanics. Écrire des textes descriptifs et de fiction clairs, détaillés, bien construits dans un style approprié au lecteur visé.
