I. Description et objectifs généraux du cours

Anti / Pre-requisites: French 1910 or French 1900E or French 1999 or Permission of the Department based on the Placement Test.

Description et objectifs généraux du cours :

Ce cours vise à améliorer les habiletés en langue française en général, tout en mettant l'accent sur la compréhension et l'expression orale et écrite. Il vise à développer les compétences linguistiques nécessaires pour communiquer efficacement en français, en particulier dans le cadre d'échanges culturels et professionnels. Les étudiants apprendront à utiliser une variété de structures grammaticales et lexicales appropriées pour exprimer leurs idées et leurs sentiments de manière claire et convaincante. Ils seront également encouragés à développer leur sens critique et leur capacité à analyser et à évaluer l'usage de la langue dans divers contextes.

Le cours se concentrera sur la production écrite et orale. Les étudiants apprendront à élaborer des textes argumentatifs et narratifs, à rédiger des rapports et des documents administratifs, et à participer à des discussions en français. Ils seront également invités à pratiquer l'expression orale à travers des exercices de conversation, de présentation et de débat. Le cours vise à développer une compréhension approfondie de la langue française, tant dans sa dimension formelle que fonctionnelle.

Objectifs principaux du cours :

- 1) sera en mesure de comprendre le contenu essentiel de sujets concrets ou abstraits dans un texte complexe, y compris une discussion technique dans sa spécialité.
- 2) sera capable d'exprimer ses idées et ses sentiments de manière claire et convaincante, en utilisant une variété de structures grammaticales et lexicales appropriées.
- 3) sera capable de participer à des discussions en français, de manière à développer son sens critique et sa capacité à analyser et à évaluer l'usage de la langue dans divers contextes.

4. Online Dictations (2*5%)

These are **two 20-minute dictations** imitated (modified) from longer texts in *Maupassant* which will be announced 72 hours prior to the opening of the dictation. The dictation is divided in short audio files recorded by the instructor; students listen to the audio file and type the words of the sentences, in Owl. You will complete these dictations in the "*Tests & Quizzes*" section in Owl.

ÉDictation A is open to take between **Thursday, June 25** at noon and **Saturday, June 27** before midnight.

ÉDictation B is open to take between **Thursday, July 9** at noon and **Saturday, July 11** before midnight.
