Course Content:

In this course students will discover the various regions of Germany through the eyes of the TV detectives. They will be introduced to the popular genre of the German TV crime drama or Fernsehkrimi shows which range from the early evening short SOKO Krimis to the film-length Tatort series, give the viewer a sense of life in contemporary Germany and often address current issues, such as race, gender, migration, the wealth gap, and the environment. The course will expand vocabulary, especially in the area of law enforcement, improve their command of grammar and their comprehension of spoken German with its regional variations. Familiarity with the characteristics of the genre will also help sharpen crime-solving skills.

Course Objectives:

to give students a tour of Germany through the medium of the TV crime drama to familiarize students with the peculiarities of the different regions and accents to introduce students to a highly successful genre of German popular culture and its characteristic features

skills in German to the next level

have acquired the tools to conduct basic research in a popular genre of German TV entertainment, and present it in oral and written form
