CourseDescription

This course aims to 10 uild the acquisition of basic Japan transguage ability by developing the grammatical accuracy, comprehension, and communicative ability in the four basic language skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) arpanese and 2) encourage awareness and enhance general knowledge of Japanese culture raised both in and outside the context of language learning.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Exchange simple conversations in **-life** situations (expressing their background, schedule, preferences, appearance, personality, hearsay, etc.) using basic grammar patterns.
- 2. Convey simple questions, invitations, offers, requests, and spenses respectively.
- 3. Comprehend authentic texts (a personal diary, postcards and letters, questionnaires, advertisements, and uncomplicated instructions, etc.).
- 4. Write a diary, a short essay about themselves, a postcard/letter, and a short story from the provided topics with appropriate usage of the syllabic hiragana, katakana, and kanji.
- 5. Appropriate usage of the basic casual and polite forms, use of particles, conjugation rules of nouns, verbs, and adjectives in the tense (present/past) and the asptern(ative/negative).
- 6. Carry out communication with cultural appropriateness by taking into account the factors such as the proper time, place, and occasions.
