## **DESCRIPTION**

This course provides an introduction to a number of fundamental issues in the field of Ethics. Somewhat perversely, we will start by examining a couple of concepts that are traditionally construed as challenges to morality: egoism and ethical relativism. Egoism opposes morality to

- 6. Be able to critically assess ethical arguments; be able to construct cogent ethical arguments.
