DESCRIPTION

In this course, we will survey the key figures and texts of the early Modern period. We will consider issues in metaphysics (the nature of substance, accounts of causality), epistemology (the challenge of skepticism, whether any ideas are innate), natural theology (proofs of God's existence), and the philosophy of mind (the nature and extent of consciousness, the relation of mind to body).
