Objectives

This course aims to help you

- x identify, understand, and evaluate claims and arguments,
- x understand the difference between different types of claims and arguments,
- x depict the structure of statements and arguments using symbolic and graphical tools,
- x recognize rational and non-rational influences on belief formation, including biases,
- x understand the importance and relevance of critical thinking skills, and
- x know when and how to apply critical thinking skills in both everyday and academic contexts.
