A. Personal Statement

I am an Associate Professor of Psychology, and my research is focused on neuropsychological changes associated with substance use disorders. I have a broad background in psychology, with specific training and expertise in ethnographic and survey research and secondary data analysis on psychological aspects of substance use disorders. As PI or co-Investigator on several university- and NIH-funded grants, I laid the groundwork for a broad-based, multi-site, longitudinal study (with 8.9 (c)-p.9 (ai)2.6) that will make it possible to recruit and track participants over time as documented in the IRB. In addition, I successfully administered the projects (e.g. staffing, research protections, coordination with other researchers, and produced several peer-reviewed publications from each of my previous experiences, I am aware of the importance of frequent communication and of constructing a realistic research plan, timeline, and budget. The current focus of my work is on my prior work. During 2015-2016, my career was disrupted due to family responsibilities. Upon returning to the field, I immediately resumed my research projects and successfully competed for NIH support. In summary, I have the expertise, leadership, and motivation necessary to successfully carry out the proposed research project.
