

Purpose / Scope



The ACC Chair will approve exceptions requiring virtual visits.

During ACC Site Visits, as an important part in fulfilling the ACC's AECP oversight role, participants will:

Observe the space and assess sufficiency (physical characteristics, environment, etc.). Seek to understand related operations and assess sufficiency. Seek to understand live animal procedures performed within each area as well as the bigger picture of the animal's overall experience from arrival to endpoint. Seek feedback from area supervisors and users on their challenges as well as their suggestions towards further refinement of the Animal Ethics & Care Program (AECP).

Provide updates to area supervisors and users on new AECP initiatives.

Post-ACC Site Visit

ACC Site Visit Reports must be completed using an ACC Site Visit Report Template (Appendix 2) and distributed as follows:

Report commendations, observations and recommendations will be forwarded to area supervisors and select users for their review and responses.

Responses to site visitor recommendations will be included in the final report.

ACC Site Visit Reports will be forwarded to the ACC Executive for review and follow-up.

o Report content will include related follow-up actions.

Closed reports will be forwarded to the full ACC.

Extra-vivarial space re-certification will be facilitated through the annual ACC Site Visit process.
