WREM System Update Tracked Changes

Dear Colleagues,

A WREM system update has come out with the ability for research teams to be able to track changes within their submitted applications. This new feature will allow applicants to compare the current state of a form being edited to the previous submission of the form, in tracked changes format. This new feature is only applicable to forms that have been previously submitted and are currently returned to the research team for changes.

If the form you are working on has been previously submitted and is currently unlocked, a new

On the '**All Changes**' tab, each page can be expanded to view changes within it, making it easier to quickly access different parts of the form to see changes there. Applicants can click on any question title to navigate straight to that question and view the changes. The question will be highlighted with a red outline to clearly denote the change in question.
