Final Exam

If you miss the Final Exam, please contact the Academic Counselling office of your Faculty of Registration as soon as you are able to do so. They will assess your eligibility to write the Special Examination (the name given by the University to a makeup Final Exam).

You may also be eligible to write the Special Exam if you are in a Multiple Exam Situation (more than 2 exams in a 2-hour period, more than 3 exams in a 4-hour period).

If a student fails to write a scheduled Special Examination, the date of the Special Examination (if granted) normally will be the scheduled date for the final exam the second time it is offered. The maximum course load for that winter will be
