

GUIDELINES GOVERNING THE ACADEMIC RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE CONSTITUENT UNIVERSITY AND THE AFFILIATED UNIVERSITY COLLEGES

This document sets out the guiding principles governing the academic relationship and reflecting the broader Affiliation Agreement between the Constituent University and the Affiliated University Colleges. It provides guidelines for the implementation of the Affiliation Agreement but does not take precedence over it.

Coordination of Admissions and Enrolments

1. Each Affiliated University College develops long-term plans for its academic mission, role and capacity, which build upon the strengths and special environment of the College, and informs Senate of those plans through the Senate Committee on Academic Policy and Awards (SCAPA) and the Senate Committee on University Planning (SCUP).
2. The Constituent University and the Affiliated University Colleges accept the objective of achieving and maintaining a reasonable and stable net cross-flow of course registrants in the context of the long-term plans of each College. The Constituent University and the Colleges also agree that students admitted with the intention of pursuing certain programs of study, i.e., Honors Specializations, Majors and Specializations, should pursue the majority of their courses in these modules at their home institutions.

10. Where an Affiliated University College offers an Honors Specialization, Major or Specialization common to that offered at the Constituent University, there will be an annual exchange of information by October of each year between the Chairs/Directors of the relevant departments or schools in the Constituent University and the Affiliated University College.
