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Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The minutes of the meeting of November 16, 2001, were approved as circulated.

Business Arising from the Minutes

S.01-249 Tax Receipt for Parking Permit Holders (S.01-192, S.01-248)

Ms. Grindrod, Acting Vice-President (Administration), responded to a question asked at the November Senate meeting as to whether tax receipts could be issued to parking permit holders, given that the fee charged is more than what is required for cost recovery. She reported that parking fees do not meet the CCRA's definition of a gift because the contributor has received consideration for the payment and the payment was not voluntary. The University, therefore, cannot issue a tax receipt for parking fees.

S.01-250 REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

The President reported on six new Canada Research Chairs, Reuters Gift, UWOFA Scholarship Reception, and a meeting at South Secondary School. Overhead slides highlighting his presentation are attached as Appendix I.

Canada Games Cash Shortfall

Dr. Davenport advised Senate that the Canada Games recently informed the University that there was a cash shortfall of approximately \$3.7 million. Under the 1997 revenue-sharing agreement between the Canada Games Host Society and the University, the \$3.7 million will be the responsibility of the University. S.01-261 Nabisco Professorship in Marketing

Professor Percival-Smith expressed concern about the volume of pedestrian traffic, given that approximately 2000 students could be crossing Perth Drive when there is a classroom change at the North Campus Building.
