Academic Consideration for Student Absence

Students will have up to two (2) opportunities during the regular academic year to use the portal to self-report an absence during the term, provided the following conditions are met: the absence is no more than 48 hours in duration, and the assessment for which consideration is being sought is worth 30% or more of the end of the period of the self-reported absence unless noted on the syllabus. Students are not able to use the self-reporting option in the following circumstances:

- x for exams scheduled by the Office of the Registrar (e.g., December and April exams)
- x absence of duration greater than 48 hours,

- x if a student has already used the self-reporting portal twice during the academic year

If the conditions for a Self-Reported Absence (SRA) are not met, students will need to provide a Student Medical Certificate if the absence is medical, or provide appropriate documentation if there are compassionate grounds for the absence in question. Students are encouraged to contact their Faculty academic counselling office to obtain more information about the relevant documentation. All requests for consideration for assessments worth more than 30% of a final grade must be directed to the Academic
