## Exam

The exam will test the skills that you have developed over the course of the semester in terms of your writing ability (purpose, coherence, cohesion, style, and grammar) and your understanding of the fundamental elements of writing for professional communication as discussed in class and in course readings.

# **Assignment Format and Submission**

In this course, you will be required to submit the final version of each of your assignments electronically, through OWL Brightspace to turnitin.com by the end of class on the day that the assignment is due. You are responsible for ensuring that turnitin has processed your assignment. Shortly after uploading your assignment, you should check your turnitin report. I will not grade any essay until I see the report.

All assignments are to be electronic (typed) documents and must have your name, course name, section number, and instructor's name on the first page. Unless instructed otherwise, do not use a cover page, which is particularly unnecessary for online submissions.

When using sources in an assignment, you will follow MLA standards for documentation, detailed in *The Canadian Writer's Handbook*, chapter 36a

Late assignments will receive a penalty of 5% per day, and they will not receive comments. To qualify for an extension, you must have a valid reason and contact your instructor prior to the deadline. Please see the medical accommodation policy below.

Do not fax or email assignments. You must keep copies (electronic, paper, or both) of all assignments submitted.

In addition to submitting final drafts on the due date for each assignment, you are required to submit a rough draft of each assignment for the scheduled peer-review sessions. Failure to submit a sufficiently complete (in your instructor's opinion) assignment or to participate in a scheduled peer-review session will result in a 10% penalty being applied to the earned grade for that assignment. In other words, an assignment that would have earned a 78, for example, will receive instead a recorded grade of 70. This penalty will be applied in addition to any other penalties incurred (e.g., for late submission). To be sufficiently complete, a draft must consist of complete sentences and paragraphs and be at least 50% of the required length of the assignment.
